The Harford 250 Summer of Fun began with a visit from the *Pride of Baltimore* to Havre de Grace. The *Pride* and vessels like it were an integral part of our country's history. This type of topsail schooner served the country well during the War of 1812, a time when Havre de Grace was attacked by the British.

The *Maryland Dove*, a replica of a small, 40-ton capacity cargo ship that accompanied the first colonists to Maryland, visits Hutchins Memorial Park in Havre de Grace, June 24 -25. The original *Dove* was purchased by Cecil Calvert and several investors so that the colonists would have a ship to use once the Ark, the passenger ship that carried the colonists, returned to England.


Juneteenth and the Freedom 5K Run/Walk

Piecing Together Harford's History

Two years ago, the Harford 250 Committee initiated plans to develop an art piece to commemorate the County's 250th Anniversary to be unveiled at the March 2024 Finale celebration. Many county residents voted on a theme for the art piece and subsequently on the artists' proposals. The winning theme – *Rooted in History: Lighting the Way to the Future* – was approved and area artists were encouraged to submit art proposals based on that theme.

The proposals were shared with the public at county events and on the Harford 250 website throughout the past year. The winning proposal was submitted by Lisa Scarbath to create a large-scale mosaic. The artwork will depict the history, personality, and culture of the county by incorporating materials donated by community residents. Once completed, Ms. Scarbath's mosaic will be installed at Bynum Run Park on Churchville Road.

Residents may become part of this historic project by submitting a small piece of their own Harford County history along with a couple of sentences describing the piece they are donating. Donations must be small pieces of durable material such as rocks, ceramic, glass, or other weather—resistant material. Examples include — a pebble from your driveway, a broken plate from a past celebration, or a lapel pin recognizing public service. The items may be as small as the donor likes, but no larger than a fist. Whatever a donor chooses does not have to be recognizable to anyone else. Please do not send anything bio-degradable such as photos, flowers, paper, etc. as these would not be suitable for incorporating in an outdoor art piece. Please note these donations are final and will not be returned.

Items may be dropped off at any local Harford County library. Collection boxes will be available in library lobbies. Alternatively, you may mail items directly to the artist.

Remember to enclose the donated item in an envelope along with a sentence or two describing the item and its meaning to the individual making the donation. This information will become part of the permanent record describing the meaning of the mosaic. Also, please include donor contact information in case the artist has questions.





It can be as small as you like, but NO larger than your fist.
